

Egdean Parochial Church Council Report

A meeting of Egdean PCC was held on 19th May, Fr Mark informed the meeting that he is planning the next Petworth Deanery training course in lay ministry for communion for 15th June and it was agreed that Jenny Foster should join both wardens on the course.

Two brass candlesticks and crucifix for the main altar and two churchwardens' wands have been purchased with the gift from the Late Michael and Tessa Till.

The Architect has visited the church for the Quinquennial inspection and the Arch-deacon's visitation is planned for 27th July.

Roger Dallyn suggested investigating installing a security camera now that the church is open at all times and it was agreed to look further into this. Anne Dallyn reported that she is waiting to hear back from Simon Knight about the possibility of enlarging the church car parking area.

The Stewardship Pledges have been reviewed and the Treasurer has advised that several new people on the Electoral Roll have added to the annual giving and some have increased their giving.

The Secretary reported that she had received a letter of resignation from John Shepherd as Treasurer for Egdean as from end of May mainly due to work pressures. A circular email has been sent out re the vacancy in the hope that someone will come forward.




Buzzards Abound

3rd January 1985, a cold winters' day, my first day of employment with the Sussex Wildlife Trust. Thirty one years and six months later, retirement beckons, and my time as an employee of the Trust is drawing to a close. Of the many changes that have taken place in terms of wildlife in Sussex during that time I have been trying to think of which species has seen the most dramatic change and there is one that really sticks out in my mind, the buzzard.

In 1985 there was estimated to be about 5-6 pairs of buzzards in the county, and the next decade showed no discernible increase in their population. However since then there has been an astonishing growth rate, and using results from the British Bird Atlas following the surveys between 2007-11, it is now estimated that there could be over 600 pairs. Now, if you are out and about in almost any part of Sussex for a morning or afternoon at any time of year, you might consider yourself unlucky not to see one at all. A good news story indeed.



Well, a great majority of people think it is, but sadly not everyone. Persecution by gamekeepers meant that by the late 19th century the buzzard population was confined to relatively few pairs in remote places in northern and western Britain. It wasn't until the second half of the 20th century when they were given full protection but then myxomatosis in the rabbit population, their main source of food, meant that recovery was initially very slow. Eventually rabbit numbers recovered and buzzards began to increase and spread to most parts of the UK including Sussex.

This increase has led some shooting organisations to call for 'loosening the protection' given to buzzards as they say that they take young pheasant chicks. Seeing that pheasants are non-native, are bred to be shot and the numbers of them killed by buzzards is minuscule compared to those run over by vehicles, there was huge outcry against relaxing the laws when it was proposed by the shooting fraternity. The idea was not taken up by the government but hasn't gone away entirely.

It is now one of the great sights over much of Sussex to see these magnificent birds circling high over our heads, their broad wings slightly pointing upwards, enjoying the thermals that allow them to survey the landscape below them, without exerting any energy by having to flap. Often it is their soft but penetrating 'mewing' call that first attracts you to search the skies for them. They are becoming more common in suburban and even urban areas and are increasingly seen on the side of the roads, ready to mop up any road casualty.



In a time when so much more of our wildlife is declining it is good to be able to write about a species that is confounding the trend. People also like buzzards; they are big, dramatic, and important as a barometer for the general health of the environment. Long may it continue to be that way.

COTTAGE MUSEUM ANNIVERSARY



At 346 it will be 1910 precisely. It's been 1910 for twenty years now, and as announced in the April magazine, the trustees celebrated with a free exhibition entitled '1910 Precisely' on Saturday 9th April in the Leconfield Hall.

On show were objects from the collections, slideshows, visitors' comments, material to illustrate life and events in 1910, and about 50 museum press cuttings from the Midhurst and Petworth Observer, charting the museum's progress from the grand opening in 1996 to the present.

The press cuttings have now been filed and are placed in the museum. The exhibition was also a chance to show some of the reserve items and recently conserved textiles, and to recall past anniversaries.

On Thursday 26th May the museum anniversary was celebrated again at the Stewards and Friends tea party at the United Reformed Church. Bob France, a costumed interpreter at the National Trust, portrayed the 3rd Earl of Egremont's butler and gave an amusing, entertaining and informative talk entitled 'What the Butler Saw'.

The centrepiece of the afternoon tea which followed was a beautiful birthday cake, made by Ann Morrill. It was modelled on the cottage and its garden, complete with flower beds, an old zinc bathtub, rain water barrel, washing line and the outside privy.







WHY NOT VISIT A CHURCH

The PRIORY CHURCH OF ST MARY AND ST BLAISE BOXGROVE is impressive by any standard, more like a cathedral than a country church. A stately relic of a Benedictine priory church, the adjacent conventual buildings are in the care of English Heritage. The original Priory was constructed in 1117 and demolished during the Dissolution of the Monasteries in 1536. It was built on the site of a Saxon church by monks from Lessay in Normandy. What remains today, as the parish church consists of the priory chancel, transepts, tower and former choir, now the church nave. The chancel has survived completely and is an outstanding example of Early English architecture. In the north transept signs of the monks' night stairs can still be seen. The south transept is now the chapel of St Blaise. The church is noted for the vaulted stone ceilings over both the chancel and nave. The 16th Century painted decoration on the vaulting is by Lambert Barnard.

The richly decorated chantry chapel was built by Thomas de Warre in 1532 - a mix of late Gothic and Renaissance and has its own vaulted roof together with its original iron gate. There is a monument to Mary, Countess of Derby in the chancel, who died in 1752 depicted giving alms to the poor, and on either side of the chancel are two chapels, St Catherine to the north and St John to the south. The three magnificent tall lancet east windows with good victorian glass stand above George Gilbert Scott's carved reredos. In the south aisle is fine Arts and Crafts stained glass by the painter and cartoonist, Mary Lownes, a founder of the Artist's Suffrage League. At the west end, Nicola Kantorowrcz's 'Creation' stained glass floods the crossing with rich colour. Note too, a memorial window to the wife of Lord Lennox, killed by enemy action in London in June 1944 it takes as its subject St Catherine of Alexandria. Before leaving, take a walk around the churchyard and look at the ruined nave and nearby ruined priory guesthouse.

EVENTS AT CHICHESTER CATHEDRAL

Chichester Peregrines: We were delighted to discover that the four peregrine chicks born in the nest high up on the Cathedral's south east turret, unusually all on the same day, back in April, are three boys and one girl. A visit was made in May to weigh, measure and ring the chicks. The small team ascended 208 steps to emerge at the base of the spire. An expert from the Sussex Ornithological Society then made a further, but precarious climb, on a small ladder to scale over the top of the turret to where the peregrines are nesting. Graham was wearing a GoPro headcam whilst doing this which has resulted in some great footage of the whole process - from lowering the chicks down to the team below at the base of the spire, to the weighing of the chicks in small hammocks, to measuring their already impressive wingspans. 


