

From Father Keith Hyde-Dunn SSC

One Sunday here after Mass I was asked: 'Who are these Saints you mention? Could you tell us something about them?' The questioner referred to two in particular - so let me say a little about those, and then offer some simple reflections upon the place of Saints in the Eucharist. These two are Perpetua and Felicity. They came from opposite ends of the social spectrum of their day. Perpetua, aged twenty-two, was born into a patrician family. Felicity was a slave. Perpetua had given birth to a son a few months before her arrest during the persecution of Christians by the Emperor Septimus Severus. Felicity, arraigned with her, was delivered of a daughter in prison. Together with other companions, Perpetua and Felicity were martyred in the public stadium at Carthage in AD203. Perpetua wrote an account of their trial and imprisonment leaving others to complete the story of their demise at the mercy of wild beasts. So it is written of them that they left the prison for the amphitheatre - 'joyfully as though they were on their way to Heaven'.

Together with Our Lady and the Apostles there are no fewer than forty-one Saints named in the heart of the Eucharistic Prayer. What are they doing there? Although the General Intercessions invite prayer in categories - Church, World, Local Community, Sick, Faithful Departed - yet at the very core of the Liturgy - the Canon of the Mass - something more personal, even domestic, was felt from earliest times to be required. Thus all the Saints invoked and venerated come from the Holy Beginnings of the Christian Family and draw us into the sacred roots of our belonging in Christ: for when we offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, it is for all times and seasons that we offer it, and for all peoples. Have we become so exclusively individualistic, so narrowly private in our worship that we fail to welcome generously the invaluable help of the Holy Communion of Saints. Perhaps the lack of large extended families leads us to commemorate only two or three of the Saints at Holy Mass. The venerable Canon in which so many are named remains normative throughout the Western Church. Brought to our shores in AD597, this Mass has the longest Consecration Prayer - yet we often opt for a shorter version, when you would think we might want to savour the richness of God's Gift: I wonder why?

EVERY SAMUEL NEEDS AN ELI

At the end of June, Bishop Martin will ordain men and women to serve as deacons.

There will be a celebratory service in Chichester, during which the Bishop will lay hands on each candidate, praying that the Holy Spirit will enable them to be servants of Jesus Christ in his Body, the Church.

After that, they will go out into the world and specifically into those parishes where they will serve and at the same time continue to be shaped or 'formed' as servants of a church which in turn seeks to serve the world, helping it to come closer to the likeness of God's Kingdom.

Parishes look forward to the arrival of new deacons who come with fresh ideas and enthusiasm as well as their individual gifts and they generally offer their new curates a very warm welcome.

The new deacons, of course, are naturally excited to begin a ministry for which they have spent two or three years preparing either at theological college or through one of the non-residential courses, but this is bound to be mixed with a few nerves about the responsibility they are undertaking.

That there are any deacons to ordain each year is dependant upon the church calling people into its service.


We are an 'apostolic' church, that is to say a church which has 'sending people out' in its DNA. Jesus called people to follow him and then made 'apostles' of them by sending them out in the service of others.

It is members of the Church who observe and discern in one another those gifts which are necessary in ordained ministry and so it is members of the Church - you and me - who must help people understand that God may be calling them to ordained ministry.

Sometimes it may be in quite young people that we discern a potential ordinand, but it is often an older and more mature Christian that is able to point out what God is doing; think of the call of Samuel.

Perhaps you are that older mature Christian. Every Samuel needs an Eli.

Roger Dallyn chaired the meeting held on Thursday 7th May 2015.

Anne Dallyn informed the meeting that our recently appointed Priest in Charge, The Rev Mark Gilbert, is likely to be installed at Petworth in September. The PCC felt that the Egdean congregation should have the opportunity to welcome and meet our new priest and it was proposed to hold a tea and cake reception immediately after the even-song service in September.

Roger Dallyn reported that The Rural Dean has informed the wardens that the next date for commissioning will be in the autumn.

It was agreed that the next Church Working Party should make the necessary connection of the water butt to the cast iron downpipe, and that the annual revision to the Church Risk Assessment should be carried out prior to our summer fund raising events.

Jenny Foster reported that the next Deanery Synod meeting has been arranged for 13th May 2015 at Seaford College and both of our representatives will be attending.



WHY NOT VISIT A CHURCH

ST ANDREW'S CHURCH, WEST STOKE is set in remote and sparsely populated countryside. When it became an independent parish is not known although it was before 1398 when John Tyngwyth is listed as its Rector.

The church is of 11th Century origin, the lofty nave walls typically Saxon, another feature of the time, the remains of a round headed window were found in the apex of the east wall during restoration work in 1931. Note the tall north doorway, which now leads into the vestry, with its round-headed arch and also dates from the 11th Century. Above the door is a carving of the head of an unknown bishop, dated 1225-1250. It was likely the south door was of the same style but was replaced in the 13th Century with a pointed arch. Over this door is a small cast iron Royal Arms as used between 1714 and 1800. Also in the 13th Century, a new chancel was constructed and a century later a priests door was provided. Subsequently this was bricked up but is still visible from outside. The wide chancel arch built in 1841dominates the nave.

Immediately above the arch, behind a roof tie beam, can be seen the remains of a fine quality wall painting dated 1190-1220 showing a crucifixion scene. It was uncovered in 1990 and photographs and an annotated drawing are hung on the south wall.

The pews, pulpit and priest's stall were all made in 1879.

The main feature in the chancel is the splendid Elizabethan style memorial to Adrian (died 1614 and Mary died 1635) Stoughton, pious parents of 16 children - some of whom having predeceased them, are shown as skulls being carried by their siblings.

Adrian Stoughton succeeded his great uncle as the Lord of the Manor of West Stoke in the late 16th Century and was Recorder of Chichester in 1601.

The 13th Century porch is interesting being two storied, it is in effect a low tower. The bell chamber contains a single bell cast in 1712. It was re-hung in 1998.

You can reach West Stoke by turning of the A286 at Lavant and heading towards Funtington.



All for the Want of a Piece of String

Now I'm very good at relaxing and just watching; my routine in the morning is to come down, get my tea and breakfast, switch on the 'Today' programme and sit and look out in the back garden and just observe.

In recent weeks, entertainment has been provided by the bit of string used to tie up the raspberry canes as it has become a much desired object for some of the birds in the garden, an essential item to adorn their nests; the problem is that the string is offering up strong resistance to their efforts to remove it.

I have two pairs of starlings making the use of the space under the roof tiles to nest in and they squabble over the rights to hang onto the canes and tug with all their strength at the string, usually to no avail. Occasionally a tiny wisp is borne away triumphantly but it is really scant reward for the effort they've put in.

When the starlings are not struggling with it, a few house sparrows try their luck but again all their hard work goes unrewarded. The canes bend with their effort but the string simply refuses to budge. Even the little blue tits have a go, sneaking in when the starlings and sparrows are off resting, probably trying to regain their strength to give it another go, but it is a futile attempt, the string remains resolutely and firmly attached to the canes, testament to the firmness of the way I tied them together in the first place.

My garden is pretty small but does seem to warrant a lot of interest from the local avian population. A pair of blackbirds think better of expending energy in trying to tackle the unmovable string so they spend the time picking up the debris scattered around and adding to the nest they've started building in the ivy covering the fence. A sense of guilt now encompasses me as I know from past years that as soon as we go out and start enjoying the garden in the warm sunshine, the birds become stressed and usually abandon the nest, our garden not being big enough to accommodate a pair of humans and a pair of blackbirds sharing the same space at the same time. As much as I love birds, I'm not going to give up my share of the spring and summer I'm afraid. I hope it is early in the year enough for them to go and find a more suit-

able and less disturbed location to raise a family.

My newly shorn birch tree attracts a woodpigeon who snaps off the thin twigs and flies off to an unknown destination with it, at least unknown to me. I've had to discourage the jackdaws as using our chimney as an ideal home, recently a sweep had to come in to remove a dense ball of twigs, amazingly each twig almost exactly the same in length.

I don't know, call myself a bird lover!
